Town of Ipswich Grievance Procedure

The following Grievance Procedure is established to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). It should be used by any individual who wishes to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability in employment practices and policies or the provision of programs, services, and benefits by the Town of Ipswich, MA.

The grievance should be in written form and contain as much information as possible about the alleged discrimination (name, address, phone number, location, and description of problem, etc.). Other arrangements for submission of a grievance such as a personal interview or tape recording will be made available for the visually impaired or those with motor impairments. It should be submitted by the grievant and/or his or her designee within 30 calendar days of the alleged violation to ADA Coordinator, Colleen E. Fermon, Health Office, Town Hall, 25 Green Street, Ipswich, MA 01938, (978) 356-6606, Health Office Hours: Monday 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM, Tuesday through Thursday 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Friday 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM.

Within 15 working days of receipt of the complaint, the ADA Coordinator, Colleen E. Fermon, will respond in writing (or a method understood by the complainant) to the complainant and/or his or her designee. The response will offer a resolution or explain the position of the Town of Ipswich with respect to the complainant.

If the response by the ADA Coordinator, Colleen E. Fermon, does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the complainant and/or his designee may request a hearing to be held within 15 working days of receipt of the response before the Ipswich Board of Selectmen, Town Hall, 25 Green Street, Ipswich, MA 01938, (978) 356-6609, Office Hours: Monday 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM, Tuesday through Thursday 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Friday 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM for resolution. Within 30 calendar days of the hearing, the complainant and/or his or her designee will receive the final resolution in writing (or method understood by the complainant) as proposed by the Ipswich Board of Selectmen.

All complaints received by the ADA Coordinator and responses from the Ipswich Board of Selectmen will be kept by the Town of Ipswich for a period of three years. These documents may be requested by the appropriate federal agency should an investigation into alleged discrimination on the basis of disability status be initiated.

FAIR EMPLOYMENT LAW

The Fair Employment Law declares that it is illegal to discriminate on the basis of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability

IT IS UNLAWFUL:

- to print or circulate any advertisement or use any application form which directly or indirectly specifies any limitation on the basis of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability.
- to discharge or reuse to hire any individual on the basis of their race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability.
- to discriminate against any individual in matters relating to compensation, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment because of their race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability.
- to require a woman to leave her job at some arbitrary stage in her pregnancy or to refuse to let her return to work until a specified time set by the employer.
- to refuse to grant a female employee at least eight weeks leave for purposes of childbirth or to treat her absence differently than any other absence due to disability.

- to require an employee to remain at work during any day or part thereof that s/he observes as a religious holiday provided that the employee gives a ten-day notice and the absence does not cause undue hardship to the employer.
- to discharge or refuse to hire any person because of their failure to furnish information concerning admission to a center for the treatment of mentally ill persons.
- to discriminate against a job applicant for failure to furnish information, written or oral, concerning: A) an arrest, detention or disposition regarding a violation of law in which no conviction resulted; B) a first conviction for any of the following misdemeanors: driving under the influence, simple assault, speeding, minor traffic violations, disturbance of the peace; or C) conviction for a misdemeanor where the date of conviction or end of period of incarceration, if any, occurred more than five years prior to the employment application, and the applicant has not been convicted of any offense within the five years immediately before the date of application.

RETALIATION:

It is illegal to retaliate against any person because s/he has opposed any practices forbidden under this Chapter or because s/he has filed a complaint, testified, or assisted in any proceeding before the Commission. It is also illegal to aid, abet, incite, compel or coerce the doings of any of the acts forbidden under this Chapter or to attempt to do so.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

151B:1,18 The term "sexual harassment" shall mean sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when (a) submission to or rejection of such advances, requests or conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of employment or as a basis for employment decisions: (b) such advances, requests or conduct have the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance by creating an intimidating, hostile, humiliating or sexually offensive work environment.

Facility Inventory LOCATION: Bialek Park (Linebrook Road)

Multi-use facility near center of town with baseball fields, basketball hoops and a field hockey field. In addition, there is a large area of play equipment with mulch surfacing, in proximity to shade/picnic structure (inaccessible), bathrooms (accessible), and several picnic tables. Between 1989 and 1999, the following facilities were added: one basketball court and one softball field; a large play structure for children of diverse ages and abilities; add-on to play structure for persons with disabilities in wheelchairs, bench swing, gazebo (not accessible). Playground equipment includes climbers, decks, climbing wall, balance beams, slides, swings, tire units, overhand ladders, steering wheels, tunnels, decks. There are safety signs for use of play elements and general park rules sign. Persons w/disabilities are welcome and encouraged to join in recreational programming.

In 2009 the old wood play structure was removed and a new structure was built closer to the parking lot with better accessibility. A handicap ramp was added to the new play area and there is room for wheelchairs in between all of the equipment. Two handicapped parking spaces were added in 2010.

- Replace the sand base under play elements with ADA compliant material.
- Develop a wheelchair accessible pathway from street parking to the play areas and tables.
- Add wheelchair accessible picnic tables.
- Add wheelchair accessible play components.
- Increase space around play elements so they are wheelchair accessible.

Facility Inventory LOCATION: Giles Firman Playground (County Road, Rte. 1A)

Small tot play area and picnic area located in the neighborhood of subsidized housing (both public and private) for families, senior citizens and persons with disabilities. There are fences in front and back of park, and wooded side lot barriers. Park is grass-surfaced with sand-based enclosed play area. Equipment includes tot swings, climber, platforms, railings, diggers, play walls, slides, steps, decks, steering wheel. Only feature designed to improve access for persons in wheelchairs is mat ramp to sandy play area. Picnic tables and equipment are not accessible for wheelchairs.

- Development of a wheelchair accessible pathway to the play area.
- Replacement of sand base with ADA compliant material.
- Addition of wheelchair accessible picnic tables.
- Addition of play components accessible to persons with wheelchairs.

Facility Inventory LOCATION: Howe Street Playground (Howe Street near corner of Linebrook Road)

Grassy, well-maintained and mowed knoll set back from street in subdivision of many homes with children. Compacted soil on path that can be used by autos to access play equipment, picnic tables and open space areas about 150' from Howe Street. Play elements include climbers, slides, play walls, decks, diggers, bouncers, and tot swings.

When the Howe Street Playground undergoes its next rehabilitation, the following accessible features should be included:

Add wheelchair accessible play components.

- Develop an accessible pathway to the play area and table/bench area.
- Add wheelchair accessible picnic tables.
- Replace sand surface under play equipment with ADA compliant material.

Facility Inventory LOCATION: Great Neck Park/Pavilion Beach (end of Jeffreys Neck Road at beach site)

Small public beach with gravel parking area, all generally undeveloped. There is a fenced play area and soccer field across the public way using same parking. Beach has rocky area where small marine vessels can be hand-launched. Barrier beach precludes improvements—in V zone on FIRM map. Accessible to most people with disabilities except those in wheelchairs. Playground equipment includes swings, slides, overhand ladder, decks, climbing net, pirate ship climbing structure and gazebo with accessibility. Equipment is accessible to those in wheelchairs, adjacent to accessible paths and is covered in rubber matting.

TRANSITION PLAN FOR GREAT NECK PARK:

Great Neck Park was rebuilt in 2009 adding rubber matting to the play structure for better accessibility and safety, accessible pathways to all equipment and overall greater accessibility for persons using wheelchairs. Pavilion Beach has had few improvements over the years beyond the installation of benches and indication of where to park and where to launch hand-carried boats. There are no facilities at the Beach.

Consolidated Transition Plan

A summary of the transition plans identified above suggest that the town should consider bulk ordering equipment for installation in the parks at the same time and under the same contract. Most or all of the parks require:

- Accessible walkways from the parking area to the equipment
- Accessible picnic tables
- Accessible base materials for under the play equipment
- Accessible equipment

This plan suggests that the accessibility improvements be implemented in the order listed above. Several paths could be laid out and installed by town staff. An order of 6-10 accessible picnic tables could be placed in the short term. This could be followed by identification of several accessible play pieces, with different models installed in different parks. This would be installed after a locationwere selected and the appropriate base material ordered.

Conservation/Recreation Areas

The Town of Ipswich is fortunate to have a variety of open parcels available for passive recreation. Most of these parcels are owned by TTOR, ECGA or the Commonwealth. The town has several parcels that are open to the public with parking and walking paths. These townowned sites are listed in the table below. Access for people who require wheelchairs on these properties is limited.

Non-Profit and State-Owned Conservation/Recreation Sites

Several important outdoor resources in the immediate area are available to people in wheelchairs. While these are not town-owned sites, they provide important access to people with disabilities who seek an outdoor experience.
