Jamie Fay has been a member of the Finance Committee since 1990, including five years as Chairman of the Committee and three years as Vice Chairman. Prior to serving on the Finance Committee, he served on the Shellfish Advisory Committee, including two years as chairman. He is the founder of an environmental and urban planning business in Boston and is a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners. He is also Vice President of The Boston Harbor Association, a nonprofit environmental advocacy organization. Jamie graduated from Hampshire College. He and his wife Maureen have five children, all of whom went through the Ipswich Public School system.

Mitch Feldman holds a B.A. in Political Science from Colgate University and a Master in International Affairs-Economic Development from Columbia University, and he holds securities licenses: series 7, 63.

He has served on the Doyon and Middle School Councils and is former President and Registrar, Ipswich Youth Soccer. He represents the Finance Committee on the Town Water and Wastewater Committees and the Long Range Planning Committee. He served on the special advisory committee to the School Committee regarding land sale, leasing and other Feoffee matters.

Mitch is a Founding member of Bellmark Partners, Boutique Investment Bank; Chairman of the Huntington Ave Boston YMCA; Boston YMCA, Finance Committee. He has 30 years experience in various positions in commercial and investment banking.

He is married to Karen Myer Feldman, and they have two daughters, Allison and Rachel, both of whom graduated from Ipswich High School. Mitch lived for 6 years in Singapore, loves Asian food and speaks Tagalog, Cebuano and Indonesian.

Prior to serving on the Finance Committee, she served for six years on the Board of Selectmen as an elected official representing the town of Ipswich as well as serving as its Chairman. She also serves on the Ipswich Housing Partnership; its primary focus is maintaining affordable housing stock. Ingrid is most widely known for her role with the Ipswich Riverwalk and prior River Festivals. In her professional life, she is an award winning and top producing REALTOR with Keller Williams and serves on the Associate Leadership Council for Keller Williams Realty offering training to agents and financial oversight. Ingrid's employer nominated her (one of 13 women selected) to attend the National Association of Banking Women BS program at Simmons College and completed that program in her role as Senior Systems Consultant for BankBoston.
