



What Goes in the Curbside Recycling Bin?

Many common household materials can be recycled curbside. Ipswich recycling is single stream (fully commingled), so all recycling can be placed in the same container!

Paper

- Cartons! Gabled (refrigerated juice, milk, etc.) and ice cream cartons (all must be rinsed and drained)
- Office paper
- Junk mail, including window envelopes (no need to remove the window)
- Paper bags
- Magazines, catalogs, and phone books
- Paperback and hardcover books (remove hard covers first)
- Newspapers and inserts
- Paperboard (e.g., snack or cereal boxes or "gray" cardboard that has not been in contact with food)
- Wrapping paper (without foil)

Cardboard

Corrugated cardboard does not need to be flattened, cut or folded.

Glass

Glass bottles and jars are accepted (neck rings and caps are allowed, but corks and labels must be removed).

Metal

- Clean aluminum foil (sheets, pans)
- Metal food cans (non-deposit and deposit – soda, soup, etc.)

Plastic

- Plastic containers labeled #1 - #7 (with lids and spouts removed)
- **No plastic bags or expanded polystyrene** (#6 – commonly known as Styrofoam)
